

<u>2009 In-Service Workshop</u>

Attendance was good at the ISW – consistent with the past several years. Several school districts refused to release teachers to attend the ISW. We will have to monitor this situation. Attendance is only one source of funding for the ISW, but it is an important source.

• <u>KMEA ISW Finale Concerts</u> The Finale Concert structure continues to work well. We used WichitaTix to sell tickets for the first time. WichitaTix was somewhat problematic, but we will continue to use them. We also used the Century II ushering service. There will be some small changes to this process, but it seems to work well and saves KMEA money.

- We will not have the Broadview for the 2010 ISW, and we are planning to not have it for the 2011 ISW. They Broadview Hotel has been purchased by the Druhry Chain. They are stripping the entire building to the studs to remodel. When they reopen, there will be only one ballroom instead of the two we currently have. For 2010, we will need two additional large rehearsal facilities, and after that, at least one new permanent facility. We also lose the guest rooms for 1-2 years. Mike Quilling and I have already begun to work on alternative rehearsal facilities. The Hyatt Hotel was full for the 2010 ISW before the 2009 ISW ended. Other convention hotels began to block hotel rooms in late February and early March.
- ISW Conductors

All State Festival Ensembles have been contracted for the 2010 ISW. All but one of the conductors have been contracted for 2011. I am working with the new Assistant Chairs appointed by President-Elect Craig Manteuffel to being contracting conductors for 2012 and 2013.

<u>KMEA Financials</u>

I will present the annual financial report at the August Board meeting. At this point, it appears that we will finish the fiscal year in good shape. Our investments will be down. No funds were placed in reserves last year. It did not seem to be a good time to investing. I plan to place some funds in CDs this year.

<u>KMEA District Managers</u>

I have developed a plan to provide assistance to the District Managers. There is now a District Manager in every District. I will be touch with the Managers soon. We will meet during the August Board meeting, and they will be invited to attend the Board meeting. This will give them a perspective on how KMEA runs if they have not been District Presidents. I will cc the District Presidents during these communications.

- <u>MENC Division Meeting and National Assembly</u> I will attend the Division Meetings in Dallas and the MENC National Assembly in Washington, D. C., in late June. The good news: now that I am Division President-Elect, MENC will pay for many of my expenses to these meetings, saving money for KMEA.
- <u>KMEA Minutes and State Concert Info On-Line</u> This has been a long process. I hope to have these projects finished by the end of the summer.
- Kansas Music Review

Harold Popp, Bob Lee and I met in May. We are looking at a new publisher. Harold and Bob are doing excellent work with the KMR and they will report on these changes.

Recent work on the KMEA website includes the following:

- 1. ISW Performance Application was renovated to include a confirmation message back to the submitting director, as well as saving the application data on the server. Directors now have the ability re-print a previously submitted application. The executive council may now track entries, including timestamps when they were submitted. This project is still in progress.
- 2. 2010 State Festival Group audition excerpts have been posted. In the past I have tried to launch the excerpts online for all groups as close together as possible. However, the chairs are rarely ready to go at the same time. Beginning with the 2011 lists, excerpts will be posted just as soon as possible after I have received them from each chair.
- 3. We are slowly moving away from having any sections more than one folder level below the root level. Below is an example of how the state festival band section is being repositioned. Old addresses will remain in place with an auto-redirect as a courtesy to visitors who have the old address bookmarked. These old addresses will be removed from the website after one year. This project is still in progress.
