	• President, <i>Martha Gabel</i> – Report stands as written. President Martha highlighted her time in Topeka and in Washington D.C. She discussed the efforts they made to advocate music's inclusion as a core class. She thanked everyone for the wonderful work they did as music advocators, especially the Government Relations Chair, Mike Quilling.
