I have been busy since the ISW and February Board meeting. Here are some of the activities in which I have been involved.

- 1. All bills have been paid and paperwork completed from the 2010 ISW. I have also met with those business leaders who help us prepare for the convention, and thank-you gifts have been sent to several business that are key to our success. Also, all employees who are paid annually at the ISW have been paid. Attendance was down slightly in all areas, but not as much as I had anticipated.
- 2. A contract has been completed with Century II for the 2011 ISW, and the Hyatt is already booked several years in advance. Dates for future ISWs through 2020 are on the web site. Renovations have begun on the Broadview, and we will be without this facility during the 2011 ISW.
- 3. KMEA will enter the year with money in the bank. I believe we may be able to make another deposit into reserves before the end of the fiscal year. This will probably go into the KMEA Fund. I anticipate that we will lose money this year, but not a substantial amount. Registration was down at the ISW, prices were a bit higher to fund the ISW, and we spent more on the KMR this year. The fiscal year ends on June 30, and the books will go to our auditor. I will have my annual fiscal report at the August Board meeting.
- 4. KMEA may receive additional funding as part of the 2009-2010 Kansas Arts Commission Operations Grant. We will know about this around August 1. We have applied for a 2010-11 Operations Grant and also an American Masterpieces grant. This latter grant is to celebrate the Kansas Sesquicentennial, and will be used to commission a new work of Kansas songs for unchanged voice choir. If awarded by the KAC, the piece will be premiered at the 2011 ISW.
- 5. By the Board meeting, I will have met with the Festival Committee and the KMR staff. I will also be attending MENC meetings in Washington, D.C. and Dallas this summer. As of this summer, I am now on the National Executive Board, so KMEA will save money for 3-5 years as MENC pays for me to attend these meetings.
- 6. KMEA is sending the CMENC State Officers to the Southwestern Division Symposium in Dallas. We will be considering sending more CMENC members in the future.
- 7. I have been working with the Assistant Festival Chairs to book conductors for 2012 and 2013. We have about half of these positions booked. I have asked the Assistant Chairs to finish these bookings by the end of this summer. The 2012 conductors are Cynthia Bradford, Middle Level Choir; Gary Green, 1-4A Band; Stephen Pratt, 56A Band; Craig Jessop, High School Choir; James Ross, Orchestra; and Ron Carter, Jazz. I have also been booking elementary clinicians for 2011, 2012, and 2013.
- 8. I hope to meet with the District Managers at the August Board meeting. If our accountant is available, I will contact them to establish the meeting days and times.
- 9. I have completed the usual organizational activities, such as managing the financial accounts, paying bills, negotiating contracts, preparing for meetings (including this Board meeting), working with the IRS and our account manager, completing IRS forms for vendors, and managing the staff, among other activities.



10. We have wonderful KMEA employees who work for minimal salaries and dedicate countless hours to KMEA. Please thank these people when you have the chance.

The Board of Directors met in April to plan the 2010 Summer Convention and discuss concerns expressed by membership. Among those concerns that KBA would like for KMEA to consider are:

Rotation of the State-Wide Festival groups so that the bands are not always at the end of the day. It takes no longer to set-up the choral risers than it does to take them down. Parents have expressed this same opinion to directors regarding the late travel time each year and feel that the honor of being last and the fair exchange of the late hours be shared by all groups.

Membership has asked if the whole program could be moved earlier with the Jazz Ensemble in late morning, first concert of large groups at 1:00, etc.

Membership would like for several sessions on adjudication allowing judges and directors to share information. Standards for ratings should possibly be consistent between band, orchestra and choirs. Reviewing this year's state large group ratings there seems to be a skewed number of First Divisions vs. Threes and Fours among the various ensembles.

Concern has been expressed regarding the loss of school funding support for teachers wishing to attend KMEA State In-Service even if they DO have groups performing.
