## V.e KMEA Advisory Board

- Festivals Committee *Dana Hamant* p. 43 We added a number of Strings to solos and ensembles. We are alternating Festival Dates to free up String Judges. Is there a possibility of adding guitar solos to Festivals? The committee asked those teachers who are asking about guitar to gather more information. The committee was approached to sponsor a String Festival. We are giving it to ASTA and it needs to be KSHSAA approved. The Music Manual needs to be reviewed. The Adjudicator forms are new.
- State Choir Chairs- *Greg Bontrager and Jane Vanderhoff* Proposed a new makeup of State Choir auditions. Each District will have a special spreadsheet to choose the Treble choir and Mixed choir. Each selection will be 45 seconds long.
- Mentoring Committee Lynn Unruh and Holly Taylor New Business #9 -
- recommended each District have a Mentoring meeting for new teachers so they feel comfortable with the District requirements.

- Advocacy John Taylor reported that the parent receptions were very good sessions. 2018 receptions were for Orchestra and 1234A Band. Those in attendance have priority seating at the concert. The cost is \$1 for reception, cookies and punch. The 2019 ISW will have 5 receptions.

### VII. NEW BUSINESS

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VII.h By-law changes.

- Will Cooper moved to accept the proposed All-State Choir formula for slot distribution for the All-State High School Choirs. Choir chairs will use updated data each year to determine the number of quartets in the treble choir and octets in the mixed choir from each district. Each district will have a minimum allotment of 2 quartets in the treble choir (8 students) and 2 octets in the mixed choir (16 students).
- Will Cooper seconded. Passed.

• Elise Peterson moved that we accept the changes to the All-State Choir audition procedures as proposed by the All-State Choir chairs. The change reads: Students who audition for District and State choirs audition using portions of ALL audition selections as indicated by the State Choir Chairs.

Rosie Sweaney seconded. Passed 10 Yay - 1 Nay

• *Bryan Kirk* moved to add freshman students to the High School All-State Ensembles beginning in the 2019-2020 school year.

EC/NE teachers want choice to be able to participate in the event it is suited to their students' ability level. Currently our 9th graders may participate in Middle Level District events as well as KCDA Treble Honor Choir and KMEA All-State Middle Level Choir. Many of our teachers would like to see this continue. NE is concerned that teachers who typically bring their students to their mini-convention will choose to not participate. We will lose membership.

• Jamie Minneman moved that entrants to the KMEA Composition Competition must be enrolled at a Kansas educational institution at the time of entry.

*Kayla Tiemeyer* Seconded. Passed.

• *Kayla Tiemeyer* moved to remove the All-State Rules and Regulations Exception: Any absence due to an emergency conflict that will affect the rehearsals or performance at the District Mini-Convention must be approved by the District Chairperson and District President. (Note: SAT and ACT tests are not regarded as emergency conflicts; however, a student may be excused for the SAT English Competency Test upon prior notification of the District Chairperson and the District President. In addition, we will add: Any absence due to an emergency conflict that will affect the rehearsals or performance at the District Ensembles must be approved by the KMEA Executive Committee for the student to be eligible for All-State Ensembles.

Jodi Reese seconded. Passed.

• Jodi Reese moved to approve the addition of the "Act of God" policy to the All-State Rules and Regulations as recommended by the District Audition Alignment Committee. The policy states:

Bryan Kirk seconded. Passed.

"Act of God": Students are required to attend all District ensemble rehearsals and performances to be eligible for audition and participation in All-State Ensembles. In the case of an "Act of God" the KMEA Executive Committee will make a decision as to what the status is for the student auditioning for State Groups.

An "Act of God" is deemed to include inclement weather, fire, emergency facility incapacity, or any other event resulting in limited or cancelled participation of the honor groups by the attendee. Exceptions to this policy, although not normally granted,
