Membership and Recruitment

Due to a large number of graduating seniors, a small freshman class, and the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, we at FHSU have seen a decrease in the size of our C-NAfME Chapter. We hope to increase our chapter membership this fall and trust that opportunities to meet as a group safely will be possible. Our recruitment efforts include hosting and taking part in a number of activities on campus and across the state. On campus, we are the hosts/guides for our scholarship audition dates that are held every Spring. We show students to available practice rooms and to their respective audition room, and we are available to answer any question from students and their families while on campus. In addition to this we take part in University sanctioned Tiger Days which allow prospective students to meet with faculty, students, get tours of campus, and learn more about what life looks like as a Tiger. On top of the on-campus activities that we take part in, we also attend the KMEA-ISW annually. Our retention is typically quite good.

Fundraising

Our chapter usually hosts a fundraiser in the fall in which we sell pastries to the Hays community. Unfortunately, due to the uncertainty brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, we made the decision to postpone our fundraiser until next fall (October 2021), in hopes that things will be more predictable. We typically do not partake in additional fundraisers due to the relationship we have with our usual partner.

Chapter Meetings

We typically hold our meetings on a monthly basis, with additional meetings for event preparation as needed. We do not have an attendance policy, but we ask that chapter members be present as much as possible. We have complied with current FHSU policies for student organizations by affording chapter members who would prefer to socially distance themselves the option to attend meetings online. To accommodate this, each meeting agenda and any



important information is sent to all chapter members via a private Facebook page and email. Our meetings are typically 30 to 45 minutes in length. The chapter president is responsible for creating the meeting agenda and running the meeting, with assistance and additional information provided by the chapter supervisor. Our chapter supervisor is quite involved in the process of meetings. Typically, the president will create the meeting agenda in collaboration with the supervisor to ensure that no pertinent information is excluded.

Professional Development

Our chapter typically takes part in two major professional development events: KCOMTEPS, and the KMEA ISW. A recent alumnus graciously recorded a video for presentation at a fall chapter meeting and discussed some of the most important tips he had for new teachers—something we have especially relied on during the pandemic. Our participation in KMEA is typically quite good, with approximately 75-80% of the chapter attending. We are trying to increase the numbers of our KCOMTEPS participants. We will be exploring ways to help fund chapter representation to KCOMTEPS in the future.

Our numbers continue to grow slowly as more freshmen are declaring music education as their major. Membership tends to fluctuate as some members walk away from the music education major and others find their calling in music education. We often have a handful of performance majors join our group for our benefits. (KCOMTEPS, ISW, snacks, etc.) We typically retain a large amount of our members.

As for recruiting, we hold a membership drive in the first semester. We, as well as the other music groups at our schools, hold a presentation at our concert hour to the new freshman. This year, due to COVID, we could not hold an in person membership drive. So, we instead filmed videos explaining how to register online to be a member and sign up for KCOMTEPS. We plan on doing more reaching out in our ensemble classes and connecting with new students in the halls between classes so that the students feel more personally welcomed into the chapter.

FUNDRAISING

We have not started any fundraising this year. We were originally planning on selling pre-packaged goods before and after concerts and during finals week, but due to concerts going virtual and our school not allowing pre-packaged food to be given out or sold, we are in the process of forming new ideas to fundraise.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

Our chapter meets on a monthly basis. As our students are highly busy we have a flexible attendance policy. However, this year we are getting stricter on attendance and it is the expectation that they should notify members of the cabinet and it is the members responsibility to ask for the agenda and get updated. We are now filming our meetings so that people who cannot attend in person, or cannot attend at all, can either participate virtually or watch the meeting after it occurs. Members who are absent receive an email with the meeting recording and the meeting notes that our secretary takes.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We have attempted to host a teacher panel in April; however, due to COVID-19 and the mental health of our chapter, we have decided to reschedule. This year, we plan on doing a hybrid/virtual panel to allow a wider variety of teachers to attend. We also plan on opening this event up to chapters all over the state. We are currently in the process of reaching out to specific teachers and forming a set panel. We have acquired specific topics that the student body at Friends would like to discuss with teachers and are forming our panel around those topics. We will have a set date for this panel as of next week - by March 5 at the latest , and we plan to start advertising, reaching out to the other chapters, and setting



up a schedule for the virtual panel over the course of March.

Future Chapter Plans

We plan on continuing our current traditions but also adding more opportunities for our chapter. These opportunities include service projects for our local music educators and hands-on professional development for our younger members. We are also beginning the push of a larger social media presence by starting an instagram page and possibly a snapchat to allow a wider variety of outlets to share what we are doing as a chapter. Our Facebook page changed from a CNAfME page to a Music Education page, due to the request of my advisor, to discuss all things music-ed. This is due to the fact that every music education major at Friends is a member of our CNAfME chapter. Due to COVID, this has been a struggle to achieve, but we continue pushing towards this goal whenever we can.

As for the teacher panel, this will be the first year that it goes beyond our school. It normally is a Friends-only event. This year, we are opening it up to the whole state. Our chapter is currently shrinking due to the loss of graduating seniors from the prior spring and fall semesters of 2019 and 2020 respectively, as well as the inability to recruit members from the incoming freshman class. As a result of all campus activities being either severely limited or prohibited, we were not allowed to hold our normal membership drive in the fall semester. The number of active members has remained fairly consistent while the number of affiliate members has decreased ever since the transition to virtual instruction.

FUNDRAISING

We fundraised \$250 last semester from chapter dues. We have not yet participated in our standard fundraisers of profit-sharing with chain restaurants and do not have plans to do so in this semester, though that may change depending on public health developments. These fundraisers have seen an average amount of \$100 earned every time they occur and will resume in the next academic year as our university is currently planning to phase out pandemic precautions. We would also like to resume plans for a t-shirt fundraiser once normal instruction is able to resume to the point that we can table in our department building.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We meet over Zoom every two weeks. As this is not a normal semester, we have not enforced the attendance requirement, and purely fun meetings have been phased out in lieu of professional development meetings that can still partially meet that need. When we were capable of in-person meetings, food was provided by the chapter due to the meeting time blocking out a standard dinner time. Meetings last around an hour and are moderated by the chapter president. Our chapter advisor is involved marginally with day-to-day operations, which meetings are included in.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We attend the KMEA ISW every year. For the first time in many years, K-State also saw representation at KCOMTEPS this year due to the virtual format. With our chapter more proactive on procuring absence excuse letters from our advisor, we hope to see attendance increase even after an in-person format resumes. We do not currently host any professional development events beyond the scope of our chapter meetings. Our attendance for those meetings sees our active members consistently attending with affiliate members popping in throughout the semester.
