MEMBERSHIP and RECRUITMENT

Our numbers continue to grow slowly as more freshmen are declaring music education as their major. Membership tends to fluctuate as some members walk away from the music education major and others find their calling in music education. We often have a handful of performance majors join our group for our benefits. (KCOMTEPS, ISW, snacks, etc.) We typically retain a large amount of our members.

FUNDRAISING

We have not started any fundraising this year. We were originally planning on selling pre-packaged goods before and after concerts and during finals week, but due to concerts going virtual and our school not allowing pre-packaged food to be given out or sold, we are in the process of forming new ideas to fundraise.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

Our chapter meets on a monthly basis. As our students are highly busy we have a flexible attendance policy. However, this coming year we are getting stricter on attendance. Our advisor has been able to add a music-ed-major-specific concert hour class where we will be able to hold meetings. This class will have a set time blocked off in every student's schedule. This way, we can ensure every member is able to attend our meetings. It is also expected that if a student will miss a meeting that they notify a cabinet member so they can receive the notes and/or a recording of the meeting. We recently met regarding KMEA ISW to go over scheduling and what the new members should expect.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We have acquired specific topics that the student body at Friends would like to discuss with teachers and are forming our panel around those topics. We have also created a list of possible teacher contacts for each grade-level, ensemble type, school/district type, experience level, etc. The topics and teachers we planned on having this year may be transferred over to next year's teacher panel.

MEMBERSHIP and RECRUITMENT

Our chapter membership has decreased in the last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. While we saw an initial increase of interest in prospective membership from our music education majors in the early stages of the pandemic, that dropped off by the end of the 2020-2021 academic term. Transitioning back to in-person meetings from synchronous Zoom meetings has maintained this trend.

We hold one initial membership drive at the beginning of the academic term that corresponds with our music education department convocation where we raffle off the payment of NAFME dues to one student out of many that give us their contact information at the convocation and attend the first chapter meeting.

Our membership retention has remained the same as it has in past years where we maintain a steady on-campus membership of around 10 to 15 active members and around 5 to 10 student teachers that are active members. As members engage with other organizations and extracurriculars within our major, they tend to leave for opportunities gained by participants of those other activities within our School of Music.

FUNDRAISING

We did not fundraise last year due to the university dictating that all student organizations remain online to reduce the spread of the pandemic. As a result of how little time people were spending on campus, our past executive board thought our usual profit-sharing fundraisers with chain restaurants close to campus would not be successful. Profit-sharing is our main method of funding chapter activities. We also use chapter dues for these purposes, as well. Our fundraisers have brought in a range of \$60 to \$200+ depending on the restaurant partner and time of year.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We hold hour-long chapter meetings every two weeks; they are presided over by the chapter president, but in case of absence, the vice president and/or secretary fulfill this role. Our chapter advisor attends full meetings upon invitation, but occasionally pops in to assess the state of chapter meetings. Member attendance is optional, but is encouraged in the upper-level music education courses to satisfy requirements regarding service to the music education department. We provide individually-wrapped snacks and drinks to the members in attendance and while these meetings primarily focus on professional development, we have also decided to designate certain meetings as either community study nights or Music Ed. Vibe Times where the goal of the meeting is socializing through music with other future educators.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our chapter meetings function as our main source of professional development outside of the KSMEA In-Service Workshop and KCOMTEPS, both of which we highly encourage and

incentivize attendance for. As stated above, we usually see attendance of 10 to 15 members depending on the meeting topic.

Future Chapter Plans

We plan on having new K-State Music merchandise produced for fundraising purposes. We also plan on holding a new event and bringing back two older events from past years; these will be a 1st-Year through 3rd-Year Teacher Panel consisting of K-State music education alumni, a Student Teacher Panel, and our Color Guard Clinic. We have also invited local in-service middle-level and elementary teachers to unpack long-term curriculum planning and individual lesson ideas for our chapter members' future use. Our officers have also discussed reaching out to the local school district once more about establishing a Tri-M chapter.

We hosted a Trunk or Treat where members could donate \$5 for hot chocolate and treats. We also continue to sell our stickers from last year to those who wish to purchase one. We are hoping to have an event this semester where we have catering and members can pay to come eat. We hope to leave the budget in a good spot for next year.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We have chapter meetings twice a month. Chapter members are highly encouraged to attend meetings so they do not miss out on what is going on within our chapter that month. We have a formal and an informal meeting each month. Formal meetings are for professional development and to hear more about what we are doing as a chapter. Informal meetings are usually some type of event that chapter members are encouraged to attend to engage with one another, build community, and have fun. Formal meetings are 30-45 minutes. Informal meetings are around 1 ½ + hours. The President runs some of them and the board members are assigned to spearhead the rest of them with the President as the overseer. Our advisor is there for reference and advising when needed, but he entrusts the board to lead most things on their own accord.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

KCOMTEPS is a requirement for most members at WSU as well as KMEA. We also have guest speakers come every semester to further professional development. There is high turnout amongst active members.

Future Chapter Plans

Since the September 2021 Board Meeting, I have:

1. Facilitated regular communications among the chapter presidents in order to prepare for ISW.
2. Participated on a virtual panel of former and current C-NAfME leaders from across the country for Mississippi State University, for students who were interested in starting a NAfME chapter.
3. Coordinated with the social media committee in order to maintain a steady schedule of social media posts when applicable.
4. Set the program and order of events for the collegiate luncheon during ISW 2022.
5. Collected applications for those who intend to run for KS C-NAfME President and prepared to help facilitate election at ISW.
6. Collected Board Reports and planned for the collegiate board meeting during ISW.
7. Met regularly with collegiate advisors in order to prepare for ISW.
8. Coordinated with the state social media committee in order to offer a “recommended list of sessions and performances during ISW for Collegiate members to attend.
9. KCOMTEPS Report: 112 total registrants, with 101 students, 3 student teachers, and 8 faculty. It is notable that this was one of the first in-person C-NAfME events following the beginning of the pandemic. A throughline of the feedback from attendees was the desire for a greater emphasis on diversity and inclusion.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

Article III-Section 2. - Changed “ He/she may participate in activities” to “**Student chapter members may** participate in activities.”

Article IV-Section 3.- Changed “Any candidate for office shall have been an officer of his/her local student chapter for at least one full semester (or quarter) prior to his/her nomination.” to “Any candidate for office shall have been an officer of **said candidate’s** local student chapter for at least one full semester (or quarter) **prior to nomination.**”

Article IV-Section 4.- Changed “Each officer shall assume his/her office at the conclusion of the first meeting of the KMEA Board of Directors” to “Each officer **shall assume office** at the conclusion of the first meeting of the KMEA Board of Directors.”

Article IV-Section 5.- Changed “Upon notification, he/she would assume office for the remainder of the term.” to “Upon notification, **said candidate** would assume office for the remainder of the term.”

Article V-Section 3.- Changed “Also, he/she is to be responsible for the collection of any monies of the organization and their record.” to “Also, **the Secretary** is to be responsible for the collection of any monies of the organization and their record.”
