We're also focused on aligning our schedule with our members' availability. We think adjusting our plans to better fit their schedules will help increase participation.

FUNDRAISING

We haven't started any active fundraising for this year yet. However, we brainstormed during our last meetings last year and over the summer, and we've recently discussed more specific details. We plan to focus on fundraising more than we have in previous years. With the remodeling of our fine arts building and the 100th anniversary of our Singing Quakers choral group this year, we're concerned that our fundraising efforts might overlap with those events. We're hoping to collaborate rather than compete with those fundraising initiatives.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

So far, we've had one meeting this year. Last semester, we decided to hold meetings every three to four weeks instead of every two weeks, as we had done the previous fall. This change was made to help prevent burnout and manage the time commitment to CNAfME alongside other college responsibilities. Unfortunately, member attendance was still lower than usual last semester, and we hope to improve that this year.

We recognize that our members have busy and conflicting schedules, so if they can't attend a meeting, we ask that they let the cabinet members know in advance. Afterward, we'll send them an email summarizing the meeting and providing a copy of the agenda.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

After discussing upcoming conferences at our first official meeting this year, our members have expressed great interest and excitement about attending K-COMTEPS next week and KMEA next semester. There are also Music Education seminars scheduled through the University Concert Hour class.

To plan joint meetings and events, we're collaborating closely with two relatively new music-related clubs on campus, the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) and the Jazz Education Network (JEN). To avoid scheduling conflicts and to prevent overwhelming our members, we want to work together and support each other, as our goals of professional development, real-world experiences, and mentorship align. We're also

looking for additional professional development opportunities.

Our membership and recruitment have increased significantly. Our membership has slowly been growing, due to more engagement with NAfME and the community surrounding Topeka. Interest has increased, but the numbers are staying more even due to there being an all around incentive rather than just KMEA ISW or KCOMTEPS.

For recruitment, we have representatives speak in the WU 101 Music class, which is a course required for freshman music majors of all kinds. We also make announcements in Music Major meetings, ensembles, classes, social media, and via word of mouth. The biggest incentives are conferences like KCOMTEPS and KMEA, but we also have food/snacks at most every meeting. Another part of our reach for recruitment comes from our chapter members, who advocate for others in the music program to join NAfME.

FUNDRASISING

We have done little fundraising this year. We do plan to redo our "Valentine's Video-Grams" again this upcoming February, and our "Wrapping up the Semester" Event this upcoming December (which both brought a decent amount of money to our organization)

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We hold meetings twice a month. Our attendance policy is that active members must attend at least two-thirds of our meetings. We bring snacks (fruit snacks, chips, capri-suns, etc.) to every meeting. We have started using ice breaker questions for roll call, and we are also trying our best to make sure that we include speakers from the community as well as Washburn professors to talk about music education and music as a whole.

The meetings last anywhere from 20 minutes to an hour. The president runs the meetings. If the president is absent, then the vice president presides. Our chapter advisor is pretty involved as she helps with our communication to the department chair and gives us great ideas for guest speakers in the meetings.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We attend KMEA. We bring local educators or student teachers to most of our meetings, which helps our chapter learn more about the experiences of teachers at various stages. This also helps our members grow connections in the community. The turnout for our meetings is most members.

This past year Washburn NAfME created an event called 501 Day, where music students of all types from the 501 school district (the main topeka school district) spent a day at Washburn. This event was very successful, bringing in around 90 students into the school. This event will be continued as talked about in "future chapter plans" and is now Called "Music Day".

Future Chapter Plans

We have many plans for this Fall semester that are really exciting. We of course plan to do our annual Instrument Petting Zoo at the Washburn Symphonic Orchestra Halloween concert that happens every year, which brings in a large number of children from Topeka and surrounding areas. We also have plans to return to a fundraising event we did last December, which raised a large portion of money, called "Wrapping up the Semester with NAfME" - where we wrapped presents, played holiday music, and accepted donations. Lastly, we plan to start working on the new version of 501 Day, a popular event we hosted last year, now called Washburn Music Day. It is still NAfME run, and is planned and organized by the executive team. The hope is that opening the White Concert Hall doors to allow for schools outside of 501 district will increase participation and raise numbers past 90-100 (which was our average participation last year). Besides that, our schedule is full of professional development, and creating the best educators we can.

WSU C-NAfME has grown slightly since last year, despite losing a few senior members who since graduated. We had about nearly 20 Music Ed freshmen join WSU C-NAfME at the beginning of the semester via the Student Organization site "ShockerSync." We encourage all Music Ed majors to attend meetings and events as we try to maintain a united, well organized and well-acquainted organization. We are especially working on ways to keep upperclassmen and student teachers actively engaged with us.

FUNDRASISING

Last year, our NAfME chapter was selected as a top student organization on campus and received a \$500 scholarship which is currently resting in our safekeeping account. We have gone through the appropriations process and received \$1500 from the Student Government Association, making a total of about \$2000 maximum spending budget for the year. This year, we plan to host two fundraisers; one in the fall to raise funds for KMEA registration fees, and one in the spring to raise funds towards purchasing C-NAfME t-shirts or other merchandise. There have been ideas of a combined NAfME and ACDA event or fundraiser at some point this year to encourage inter-organizational interaction.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We plan to hold a meeting every month. We do not currently have an attendance policy in place. We provide a table of snacks for every meeting which serves as strong enticement. We discuss business matters and upcoming events first thing, then follow that up with a guest speaker, lecture or discussion, a game or craft, or other opportunity to socialize with other members. Meetings are run primarily by the President but with assistance from the other officers, and typically last about an hour. The Secretary records the minutes of the meeting which are then sent out to the organization for those unable to be in attendance. Our chapter advisor is involved in the planning of meetings and events and sits in on our meetings and offer his voice when he has the availability to do so. Our first meeting in September had about 25 students in attendance. The annual NAfME BBQ was a success with nearly 35 students in attendance, as well as all 4 Music Ed faculty and their spouses.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our main opportunities for professional development are KMEA and KCOMTEPS. WSU also hosts a Kódaly workshop every fall for area music educators to attend. We plan on inviting guest speakers to a few meetings, potentially including student teachers, graduate assistants, or perhaps a local well-known educator from one of the nearby schools.

Future Chapter Plans

We are greatly looking forward to the year ahead! We have two new fundraisers scheduled,

one in the fall for KMEA registration funds, and one in the spring to purchase CNAfME merchandise. Underclassmen members are one of our heaviest focuses as we aim to help them feel welcome and keep them engaged and active with us. In order for our chapter to survive, we must keep them involved as early as possible. We hope to find new incentives to encourage higher rates of attendance at all meetings and events as the year progresses. We've considered the possibility of an event hosted at the business building across campus that has a coffee shop inside – perhaps a percentage of the proceeds earned could go towards a C-NAfME fund. Student-led ensembles would likely provide the entertainment for this event, perhaps a talent show of sorts!
