MEMBERSHIP and RECRUITMENT

Currently, the Fort Hays State University NAFME Collegiate chapter has 24 active members. In general, we have remained consistent in our chapter size; however, we do have 4 more members than last year. We have several means of recruiting. Each spring, we help run the scholarship auditions, getting our name out to students before they are enrolled at all. Once the semester starts, we once again speak to the new students, at department meetings or other events. This year, the President and Secretary/Treasurer made an appearance at orientation week to inform the students about the chapter and to answer any questions.

FUNDRAISING

Our primary fundraiser is held each fall semester through food sales. Last year, we sold a total of \$3180.00 of products and retained a 50% profit, which was \$1590.00. We have established a loyal group of supportive patrons who purchase items every year, and have even contacted us inquiring when the fundraiser will start and requesting us to come to them. We will continue to host this fundraising event.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

Each month, we hold at least once meeting, from 2:30 to 3:20 p.m. Attendance at meetings is highly encouraged; however, we do not currently have a policy for dismissing members based on chapter meeting absences. Our chapter is highly active in departmental service, scholarship events, and community service, all of which occasionally conflict with our designated meeting time. Each meeting is run by the chapter's president with the assistance of the other two officers. The advisor is always in the room to help guide the meetings and answer any questions that may arise. In addition to assisting with the meetings, our advisor also assists the officers in the official and financial upkeep of the chapter. She is also preparing a session to present at the NAFME National In-Service Conference this fall.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Professional development is one of the big focuses of the chapter. We attend the KMEA In-Service workshop as a chapter, traveling to and from Wichita and lodging together. Each year, we devote the meeting following the conference to share what we learned, so as to give every member as much benefit from the conference as possible. Our members have also attended professional workshops in their specific area of study. We've had two members travel to North Carolina and to France for different Opera workshops. Some of our members are also members in the North American Saxophone Alliance, the International Clarinet Association, and the Student National Association of Teachers of Singing, and have attended conferences on both the regional and national level. One of our current members was one of three (the other two have graduated and hold teaching positions) who attended the 2014 National NAFME Conference in Nashville with our chapter advisor.

Two of our members worked with our advisor in creating listening guides for parents and area music educators to help prepare children for the Hays Symphony Orchestra Children's

Concert in October, which is one of the most attended events held on our campus.

Future Chapter Plans

The chapter has contributed to the establishment of the John E. Huber Memorial Scholarship, which will be available to a music education or piano performance major. We are an integral part of the Hays Symphony Orchestra children's concert. This was our second year hosting the Instrument Petting Zoo in the auditorium before the concert, introducing children of all ages to the various instruments in the orchestra, and giving them the chance to play them. We assisted with children's programs during the week of Oktoberfest in Hays, where we introduced the children to the instruments of polka music.

Though they are not yet plans so much as they are ideas, we have discussed the possibility of creating a summer program for the area children, as well as sponsoring a 5k run/walk. This year, we hope to reach more members of the community. In addition, our chapter members are working together in creating a recruitment video for the music department.

MEMBERSHIP and RECRUITMENT

We are up in numbers from last year due to several new freshman who joined the chapter. We gave a presentation in a class that all music majors are required to take about why they should join and then took one of these class periods to take everyone interested to a computer lab and walk them through the signup process.

FUNDRAISING

Every year we participate in an on campus Christmas tree decorating competition in which the top three groups get a monetary prize. This isn't "fundraising" in its technical form, but it is a way in which our chapter attempts to make money. This last December we got 2nd place and won \$75

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We have chapter meetings once a month on the first Monday when Friends has no music or education class conflicts. Food is a staple in all meetings. They usually last about an hour with some running shorter and some, like when we have our Christmas party, that last longer. The chapter president, Marleah, leads the meeting but our chapter advisor is almost always present.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We attend KCOMTEPS and KMEA annually. Last year we had 17 and 20 participants, respectively.

TRI-M

Last year Friends University and Wichita State University collaborated with TRI-M Chapters from Wichita East and Wichita Northeast High Schools on a joint service project. We collected a total of 505 hair brushes, 102 head phones and over \$300 in monetary donations for the Wichita Children's home. This year we are doing a different project and haven't involved any TRI-M chapters.

Future Chapter Plans

Throughout the semester, we will be working with the special needs class through a program we call "Friendship Fields". Also, throughout the year, our chapter assists our school by volunteering as ushers for the various concerts put on by the music, theater, and ballet departments. This helps out the main office; it opens our members up to all the different things happening in the school; and gives us opportunity to just be supportive and involved with the campus and our fellow classmates. In addition to attending the ISW and KCOMTEPS we will also have a service project in the spring where we will take several potted plants to local music teachers during March, music in our schools month.
