Our numbers continue to grow slowly as more freshmen are declaring music education as their major. Membership tends to fluctuate as some members walk away from the music education major and others find their calling in music education. We often have a handful of performance majors join our group for our benefits. (KCOMTEPS, ISW, snacks, etc.) We typically retain a large amount of our members.

As for recruiting, we hold a membership drive in the first semester. We, as well as the other music groups at our schools, hold a presentation at our concert hour to the new freshman. This year, due to COVID, we could not hold an in person membership drive. So, we instead filmed videos explaining how to register online to be a member and sign up for KCOMTEPS. We plan on doing more reaching out in our ensemble classes and connecting with new students in the halls between classes so that the students feel more personally welcomed into the chapter. Next year, we will try our best to resume the in person drive and include some of the technological methods we used to reach a wider range of students.

FUNDRAISING

We have not started any fundraising this year. We were originally planning on selling pre-packaged goods before and after concerts and during finals week, but due to concerts going virtual and our school not allowing pre-packaged food to be given out or sold, we are in the process of forming new ideas to fundraise.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

Our chapter meets on a monthly basis. As our students are highly busy we have a flexible attendance policy. However, this coming year we are getting stricter on attendance. Our advisor has been able to add a music-ed-major-specific concert hour class where we will be able to hold meetings. This class will have a set time blocked off in every student's schedule. This way, we can ensure every member is able to attend our meetings. It is also expected that if a student will miss a meeting that they notify a cabinet member so they can receive the notes and/or a recording of the meeting.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

This year, we plan on doing a hybrid/virtual panel to allow a wider variety of teachers to attend. We also plan on opening this event up to chapters all over the state. We have acquired specific topics that the student body at Friends would like to discuss with teachers and are forming our panel around those topics. We have also created a list of possible teacher contacts for each grade-level, ensemble type, school/district type, experience level, etc. The topics and teachers we planned on having this year may be transferred over to next



year's teacher panel.

These opportunities include service projects for our local music educators and hands-on professional development for our younger members. The 2020 – 2021 academic year saw K-State's CNAfME chapter shrink slightly due to the loss of graduating seniors and lack of recruitment among the first- and second-year students that tend to make up the majority of our active member population. We have not taken any severe losses, and instead, slowly shrank over time. Going into next year, the goal of our executive board is to revamp our membership drive, create a better method for communication, and speak to our department advisor about reinstating the requirement for all students in music education classes to attend a minimum number of meetings every semester. We have not planned on whether or not to return to in-person meetings but seeing how many students will be vaccinated and would prefer their activities to return to normal, we will likely do so and keep Zoom as a backup plan/accommodation.

FUNDRAISING

We did not fundraise in the spring semester of this past academic year, but with the full return to campus planned for the next academic year and public health becoming more stable, we will be able to resume our profit-sharing fundraisers with local chains like Panda Express and Chipotle. As stated in our past reports, these one-day fundraisers usually bring in \$100 on average to the chapter each time we do them; we have seen the profit range anywhere from \$40 to \$200+ in the past three years, depending on chapter engagement and foot traffic on specific days. Our board also plans to commit to a merchandise fundraiser (most likely shirts) that can supply us with a more consistent income if all goes well. Finally, we also use chapter dues to start with a strong yearly budget and can anticipate anywhere from \$200 to \$400 in the fall semester with the possibility for more if recruitment goes well.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We meet over Zoom every two weeks. As this is not a normal semester, we have not enforced the attendance requirement, and purely fun meetings have been phased out in lieu of professional development meetings that can still partially meet that need. When we were capable of in-person meetings, food was provided by the chapter due to the meeting time blocking out a standard dinner time. Meetings last around an hour and are moderated by the chapter president. Our chapter advisor is involved marginally with day-to-day operations, which meetings are included in.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

For professional development, a large number of our active members attend the KMEA ISW every year. We also saw attendance at KCOMTEPS this year for the first time in at least the last five years due to the virtual format and coordination with our advisor on excuse letters. We





intend to continue requesting excuse letters for these events since they can be instrumental in giving our members networking opportunities and pedagogical advances they would otherwise go without. Our chapter meetings also feature professional development opportunities as we try to use them to supplement what we gain in classes or introduce our members to materials they would not see unless they looked elsewhere (such as a presentation on hip-hop in the classroom). These meetings see good attendance from our active members; usually half of them attend, but we did see this trend downward as the end of the year approached.

Future Chapter Plans

As stated above, we plan on working to restore the music education course requirements to include involvement with CNAfME and begin our merchandise fundraiser, beginning with t-shirts and possibly branching out once we secure a design. After speaking to our advisor, we are also planning a revision of our constitution to help aspects other than the day-to-day business run more smoothly. We may also look to coordinate meetings and other activities with other organizations on our campus, other CNAfME chapters in our state, and even other organizations outside of Kansas to see if we can stimulate recruitment, professional development, and networking.

The number of current members is one more than last year. Our chapter has stayed the same size, but the number of active members has increased. We recruited via social media, posters, and making announcements in classes and marching band this year. Our retention in years past has dwindled as the academic year comes to a close.

FUNDRAISING

We hosted two fundraisers last year- a Chipotle fundraiser and a Giving Bean fundraiser. The Giving Bean fundraiser was effective, but the Chipotle fundraiser was not, due to a blizzard. As a result, the Giving Bean revenue was \$231.48, and the Chipotle revenue was \$67.40. Most of our chapter revenue comes from chapter dues. We are still working on finalizing fundraising plans for this year.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We have chapter meetings once a month, for one hour. We have no current attendance policy. We bring in guest speakers, and have social events in the works as well. The executive board runs our meetings, and our chapter advisor often does not show up to chapter meetings or our executive meetings, but is always around if we need help.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our chapter attends KMEA, and we were trying to boost KCOMTEPS this year. We are working on hosting an inter-collegiate conference this spring, and most of our chapter attends KMEA, but almost no one attends KCOMTEPS.

Our numbers have grown compared to last year due to lack of COVID restrictions. Members have been more active and involved in the events we have hosted thus far. Our chapter is continuing to grow exponentially. The board does a lot of networking to first-year students in casual settings like before and after ensemble rehearsals. We also get permission from professors teaching first-year classes to come speak about NAfME during the first week of school. Retention is high compared to last year. The sophmores who were reserved/in hiding last year as freshmen due to COVID are more active in this year's chapter. Freshmen who came in this year seem excited as well. Retention has the possibility to taper off at both ends of the academic year.

FUNDRAISING

Last year we raised about less than \$100. To fundraise last year we sold stickers to students throughout the year. Our fundraisers were pretty effective within the constricts of COVID. This year we have plans to have a pumpkin painting fundraiser. We also may do some kind of fundraiser through the chapter by selling chocolate or something to that caliber. Our Student Government just approved a rolling budget for this year which has given us a good foundation to build off of to support this year's chapter and future ones to come.

CHAPTER MEETINGS

We have chapter meetings twice a month. Chapter members are highly encouraged to attend meetings so they do not miss out on what is going on within our chapter that month. We have a formal and an informal meeting each month. Formal meetings are for professional development and to hear more about what we are doing as a chapter. Informal meetings are usually some type of event that chapter members are encouraged to attend to engage with one another, build community, and have fun. Formal meetings are 30-45 minutes. Informal meetings are around 1 ½ + hours. The President runs some of them and the board members are assigned to spearhead the rest of them with the President as the overseer. Our advisor is there for reference and advising when need be but he entrusts the board to lead most things on their own accord.

KCOMTEPS is a requirement for most members at WSU as well as KMEA. We also have guest speakers come every semester to further professional development. There is high turnout amongst active members.
